

The photographs below show progress being made on the new chapel in the village of Wetali (Viqueque Parish). Wetali is a small village about one hour from the main parish church. <u>Our parish</u>, <u>St Mary's</u>, <u>has provided the money for the construction of the chapel</u>.

Progress on the chapel was slow due to covid restrictions and the availability of materials but the plan is now to complete the chapel by the end of the year. Fr. Tiago (assistant priest in the Viqueque parish) has taken a "hands-on" approach in the final stages of construction.



The Viqueque parish car can be seen in one of the photographs above. Our parish, St Mary's, purchased the car many years ago. Although the car is well cared for, it now needs some expensive maintenance. If you are able to help by making a donation, it would be very much appreciated.

The photos below show the inauguration of the new chapel in Uaimoritula, one of the Mass stations in the Viqueque parish. The inauguration was held last Saturday (1st October). <u>Once again, St Mary's, helped provide the money for the construction of the chapel.</u> The chapel was blessed and opened by the archbishop of Dili, His Eminence Virgilio Cardinal Do Carmo da Silva SDB. The inauguration was celebrated with Mass, music, singing and dance!
