### Leadership and Management News

With hay fever season upon us, a reminder that if your child requires any medication to be administered at school please ensure a **Medical Management Plan** is signed by your child's medical practitioner. Parents/legal guardians must also complete a **Medical Authority Form**. We can no longer administer medication without both of these documents being completed in full - this includes both over the counter or prescription medication. Please note that an 'in date' Anaphylaxis Plan and Asthma Management Plan signed by your child's health practitioner **does** replace a Medical management plan.

Kelly Club is very excited to announce we will start operating a Before School Care and After School Care program at St Margaret's Primary School in Term 1 2023.

Kelly Club provides OSHC before and after-school care programmes throughout Victoria. Our aim is to provide not just 'a childcare facility', but to create a safe environment where children can have fun and benefit from in a number of ways.

Kelly Club is closely aligned with Kelly Sports. Kelly Sports has been providing a range of curricular and extra-curricular sporting programmes for children in Australia since 1994.

Our OSHC programmes are focused on sports, cooking, art and craft activities as well as structured 'free-time' around a busy day at school. These activities are incorporated into themed subjects each week that give children the opportunity to extend their learning outside of the school classroom. We believe it is important that children get the opportunity to enjoy play and engage with friends, while being under the supervision of quality staff, during out of school care programmes.

### Typical Day at Kelly Club After-School Care Programme

- 3.20pm Children arrive and find a small activity to do before afternoon tea
- 3.30pm Daily plan explained to the children
- 3.35pm Afternoon Tea
- 3.45pm 4.45pm Structured themed activity; craft, cooking, or sports based
- 4.45pm Structured Free Play
- 5.00pm Snack time
- 5.10 6.00pm Structured free time (e.g. homework, read a book, board games, play outside)


Programme fees will not be charged if a child is away from Aftercare as long as you notify us 24 hours prior. We accept casual bookings, so there is no minimum number of days you must book.

## CCS (Childcore Subsidies)

Your family can enjoy up to an 85% reduction in Kelly Club fees – depending on factors like combined family income, activity test, and service type. The subsidy is poid directly to Kelly Club and will be passed on to eligible families as a fee reduction. Additional subsidies - up to 100% - may also be available depending on your situation, including if you are studying, experiencing linancial bardship, starting a new business, or are a grandparent with custody of your grandchild. 

### **MY MOTIVATION**

Globally, the rate of suicide is alarmingly high, particularly in men. We lose 60 men to suicide globally every hour. Too many men are 'toughing it out', keeping their feelings to themselves and struggling in silence.

We need to normalise speaking up when we are struggling for our young people. As 60 is such a significant number (and I already have a questionable moustache), for every \$1 donated I will run 60 metres. This will be done around the cross country track at my school during recess and lunch to encourage discussion and the importance of speaking up within the school community.
