Commitment to Child Safety

Here at St Margaret's, we firmly believe all students enrolled, and any child visiting, have a right to feel safe and be safe all of the time. The wellbeing of children in our care will always be our first priority and we have zero tolerance for child abuse. At St Margaret's we strive to maintain a child safe and child friendly environment where children feel safe and are free to enjoy life to the full without any concern for their safety. We are committed to continually reviewing our Child Safe policies and practices to ensure that every effort is made for ongoing improvement of our Child Safe environment. We at St Margaret's recognise that some groups of children are particularly vulnerable, and we are committed to promoting the cultural safety of Aboriginal/linguistically diverse children and also promoting the safety of children with a disability. Please make yourself familiar with our Child Safe Policies and Procedures which can be accessed on the school website.



Medication

If your child requires any medication to be administered at school in 2023 please ensure the **MEDICAL MANAGEMENT PLAN** is signed by your child's medical practitioner.

Parents/legal guardians must also complete a MEDICAL AUTHORITY FORM.

We can no longer administer medication without both of these documents being completed in full - this includes both over the counter or prescription medication.

NB: An 'in date' Anaphylaxis Plan and Asthma Management Plan signed by your child's health practitioner does replace a Medical management plan.
