Dear Families.

We are looking forward to our whole school sports day at Landy Field on Friday April 28th. An outline of the day is provided in this newsletter. We ask that all students come to school on this day and be bussed to Landy Field. At the end of the day ALL students will need to travel back to school and be collected as normal. Kelly Club will run after school as well. Although a coffee van with limited food is available, we ask that only parents purchase items from here. Students must bring their own packed lunch and not share food as per our school policy.

From term 2 our morning supervision at the beginning of the day will change slightly. Our first bell to begin supervision will now be rung at 8.40am. Students are able to enter the main building at 8.40am and the yard will also be supervised from this time. Kelly Club will extend their hours in the mornings to 8.40am to accommodate this change. This change has been made due to the new Enterprise Bargaining Agreement that aims at reducing teacher workload. We encourage all students to quickly drop their bag into the classroom and head outside to catch up with friends before school. We also ask that students are not left unsupervised in the yard or at the back gate prior to 8.40am as this poses a child safety risk. Any student left unsupervised will be taken to Kelly Club until 8.40am at the cost of families.



It's hard to believe we are at the end of Term One already. We have had a busy term filled with so many wonderful learning opportunities for our students. Term 2 begins on Wednesday, April 26th for all students. Our staff will be participating in Professional Learning on Monday, April 24th before the ANZAC Day public holiday on the 25th. Uniform Reminder

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of our school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the dress code.

With the changing weather approaching we are mindful of this impacting which uniform the students will be most comfortable in. For the first 2 weeks of term 2 we don't mind which uniform your child chooses to wear on dress uniform days - they can choose the summer or winter uniform.

However we do ask that whichever uniform is chosen is worn correctly. Eg: all summer or all winter uniform - not a mixture of both.

Other uniform reminders:

- School uniform includes black school shoes
- All hair that sits below a student's collar must be tied up
- Hats must be worn until the end of term 1 and from the beginning of term 4 but are strongly encouraged all year
- Jewellery is not to be worn apart from a watch (smart watches not preferred) and, for students with pierced ears, a pair of simple studs or sleepers in the ear lobes only
- Makeup, false eyelashes, nail polish or false nails are not permitted.

Attendance

Schooling is compulsory for children from 6–17 years in Victoria unless an exemption from attendance has been granted. Daily school attendance is important for all children to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially and developmentally. Children who regularly attend school and complete year 12 or an equivalent have better health outcomes, better employment outcomes and higher incomes across their lives. It is very important that children develop habits of regular attendance at an early age. Students are expected to attend the school in which they are enrolled, during normal school hours every day of each term, unless:

- there is an approved exemption from school attendance for the student, or
- the student is registered for home schooling and has only a partial enrolment in a school for particular activities.


