It was wonderful to see the students settle back into school routine quickly for term 3 and catch up on their adventures from the school holidays! All our students engaged with learning for NAIDOC Week to celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth. Our hallway proudly displays many of the learning experienced for NAIDOC Week and the importance of recognising and celebrating our First Nations culture.

We welcome Fr Sijeesh Pullankunnel to the St Margaret's Church where the St Sebastian's Syro–Malabar Mission Geelong is now located. The Syro-Malabar Mission is a Catholic Church, tracing their origins and faith to the missionary efforts of St Thomas the Apostle. The Syro-Malabar Catholic Church is a Major Archiepiscopal Church in full communion with the Apostolic Roman Catholic Church. The Syro–Malabar Church is one of the 23 Eastern Catholic Churches in the Catholic communion. It is the second largest Eastern Catholic Church, the largest being the Ukrainian Catholic Church. The Syro-Malabar Church follows the East-Syrian liturgy which dates back to the 3rd century. The Church Blessing and Holy Qurbana was held last Sunday. We look forward to our continuing partnership with Fr Sijeesh and are fortunate to share the Church with the Syro-Malabar community.



We are excited to announce that St Margaret's has joined the Aussie of the Month civics recognition program This is delivered by the same network that presents the prestigious <u>Australian of the Year Awards</u>. Aussie of the Month recognises and celebrates personal endeavour, achievement, and contribution to the community and reflects the universal values we share as Australians,

such as fair go, mateship, respect and inclusion. Aussie of the Month has been operating for over 20 years and is endorsed by the Education Department in every State and Territory in Australia. It is a monthly student award in recognition of civic contribution, rewards behaviours that reflect our responsibilities as community citizens, and has the support of the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) as a complementary program aligned to the Primary Years' curriculum. Each month our students and staff will nominate a peer for this award. A panel of staff and student leaders will then discuss and decide on the recipient. At a specified assembly the Aussie of the Month will be presented with their certificate, stationery gift and lapel badge. We hope to also notify the student's family beforehand. The first Aussie of the Month will be announced on Friday August 4th.

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We acknowledge the traditional owners of the land that St Margaret's is located on, the Wathaurong people. We pay our respects to Elders' past, present and emerging and acknowledge the importance of Aboriginal culture in all the work we do.

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS): Monday 28 August – Friday 15 September 2023

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

A significant and formal way in which we engage and gather data is through MACSSIS, the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys.

MACSSIS is a set of surveys that have been built specifically for Catholic schools in Melbourne by the Learning Services team at MACS, in partnership with researchers at Learning First and in wide consultation with principals in our schools.

In 2023, students, families and staff are invited to participate in MACSSIS via our secure and purpose-built online platform. The online platform is where our school leaders will access the summary reports that visualise the results of the student, family and staff surveys.

The MACSSIS survey platform is operated by an independent supplier, ORIMA Research Pty Ltd. The platform meets with the high security and privacy standards for handling student and school data. Participating schools are in the process of updating their privacy policy to ensure school communities are fully informed and protected.

Further information, including student consent forms for our Year 4-6 students will be distributed to families shortly. Secure login details will also be shared with families.

We hope you take the time to complete the survey so we can continually improve our school.

Please watch over them, protect them and care for them now. May they know your goodness and love always.




