We are aware that some families within our school community are experiencing difficulties accessing speech therapy services for their children within and around the Geelong area. We have been made aware of an outreach program delivered via telehealth from Confidence Speech Pathology Services, who are located in Melbourne. They currently have some availability to assist students through their telehealth service. At this point in time our school does not have the finances to access the Language/Speech Therapy Assistance program.

Our 3-6 students were involved in a cybersafety session with Robbie Noggler from Victoria Police last week. We encourage our families to continue these conversations with their children throughout their schooling and to access the resources and information we share with you around this very important and serious topic. 
All students attending St Margaret's Primary School have the right to feel safe.

We continue the conversation around bullying and resilience with an incursion on Tuesday July 25th. All of you students will be involved in a session. The incursion introduces a cartoon boy named NED who is on a very important mission: to find his mindset. Led by clues and memorable characters, he overcomes Mt. Everest's toughest obstacles, uncovers inner-treasures on a Caribbean island, and grows his brain while repairing a sputtering spaceship. Throughout the performance, students discover how to activate their growth mindset to overcome social, emotional and academic challenges.


If the weather is inclement we will move it all into the Café & Pioneer Room areas.





Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS): Monday 28 August – Friday 15 September 2023

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

A significant and formal way in which we engage and gather data is through MACSSIS, the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys.

MACSSIS is a set of surveys that have been built specifically for Catholic schools in Melbourne by the Learning Services team at MACS, in partnership with researchers at Learning First and in wide consultation with principals in our schools.

In 2023, students, families and staff are invited to participate in MACSSIS via our secure and purpose-built online platform. The online platform is where our school leaders will access the summary reports that visualise the results of the student, family and staff surveys.

The MACSSIS survey platform is operated by an independent supplier, ORIMA Research Pty Ltd. The platform meets with the high security and privacy standards for handling student and school data. Participating schools are in the process of updating their privacy policy to ensure school communities are fully informed and protected.

Further information, including student consent forms for our Year 4-6 students will be distributed to families shortly. Secure login details will also be shared with families.

We hope you take the time to complete the survey so we can continually improve our school.


