


#### From Susan's Desk

#### St Margaret's Parents and Friends Auxiliary Report for 2023

St Margaret's P & F would like to thank our community for helping us raise funds for the school, as well as provide wonderful events and eight special lunches for our students.

We are sure the students will have fond memories of all the events held this year, including the Art Show, Colour Explosion, pancake races, mother's day cake stall, muffins with mum, donuts with dad, footy jumper raffle, Easter egg raffle, thermomix raffle, and the mothers and fathers' day stalls.

The grown-ups also enjoyed the Bogan Bingo Night too.

Our profit for the year was \$29,200.

Included in this is the profit from the Colour Explosion of \$11,930, which was an amazing effort. Special lunches made a profit of \$6,384.
