Dear Families,

It was wonderful to see families at Mass over the weekend as they expressed their interest for their child to prepare for a sacrament this year. Sign up Masses continue next weekend. If you wish for your child to prepare for a sacrament this year, but are unable to attend one of these Masses, please contact Joel Kearney as soon as possible. This is an important step on your child's faith journey and a continued commitment to support your child in their faith development.

As we prepare for Easter, each Friday the whole school will gather under the tree at the end of recess for a Lenten Liturgy. Our student school leaders guide us through prayer and reflection during this time. Lent is an important time of reflection, growth and new beginnings. We use this time to show devotion to our faith, draw closer to God and prepare for Easter. We encourage our students to think about ways we can show kindness and to do something that will help us follow Jesus more closely.



Last week we held our parent teacher interviews where staff and parents were able to meet and discuss how each student is settling into the 2024 school year. It was wonderful to see many parents around the school and being welcomed into their child's classroom space. PSGs will continue over the next few weeks for families requiring these. Please ensure you have selected a time through PAM for these discussions to take place.

The Year 5 /6 excursion went ahead yesterday after being postponed to the heat last week. Students engaged in activities at the Botanical gardens and discussed ways they can become 'fir for life'. This excursion complimented the students learning through their inquiry unit this term.

On hot weather days we limit the amount the time our students spend outside. The oval may be closed, and students have half their play in the classroom and half outside in the yard where it is shady. On extreme weather days, students will stay indoors. We make these decisions during the day, depended on temperatures and general outside conditions. Please ensure your child has a named hat, drink bottle and has applied sun cream during term 1 and in these extreme weather conditions.

Our Prep to Year 4 students engaged in learning around dog safety on Monday. It was a wonderful way to sow our students safe ways to engage with familiar and unfamiliar dogs that they may come into contact with. These experiences are important for our children to learn about in a safe and controlled way.

A reminder that we have our P&F meeting tonight at 7pm in the staff room and we look forward to high attendance for those parents that are willing to help out. We have our first special lunch, pizza, this Friday and I know more helpers for this would be greatly appreciated. Looking forward to seeing you at the meeting tonight.

#### **Statement of Commitment**

Particular attention is paid to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children and children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, as well as the safety of children with a disability. Our complaints process is child-focussed and responsive to the concerns of children and young people.

St Margaret's Primary School is committed to preventing child abuse and identifying risks early, and removing and reducing these risks both in physical and online environments. We have robust recruitment practices to reduce the risk of child abuse. We are committed to regular and ongoing education and training on child safety and wellbeing for our staff and volunteers.

St Margaret's Primary School acknowledges that parents and carers know their children best. We are committed to informing and involving families in child safety and wellbeing at the School.

Every person involved at St Margaret's Primary School has a responsibility to understand the important and specific role they play individually and collectively to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of all children and young people is at the forefront of all they do and every decision they make.


# What's Happening
