# Let's Thank the Parents and Friends Committee

Our generous Parents and Friends committee makes so many things possible for our students. It is with great appreciation that I share where these incredible fundraising dollars have been spent recently.

# Let's Get Writing

This year we have reintroduced handwriting lessons for all year levels. This involves explicit, modeled instruction and practice for 10 minutes at least 3- 4 times per week.

We know that handwriting proficiency reduces the cognitive load of writing tasks for students. When handwriting becomes more automatic, students are free to focus their attention on other writing processes. An article recently in The Sun- Herald this weekend, discussed how high school teachers are seeing a decline in handwriting skills, to the students determent. <u>Bad Handwriting? Stay After School</u>

A variety of resources are needed for this type of instruction as it requires the teacher to model correct formation, spacing and sizing. In preparation for 2024 the Parents and Friends committee generously provided funds for every student in the school to have a lined, magnetic writing strip. Larger, lined magnetic boards have also been purchased for every class.

The great news is that teachers have already noticed improvements in their students' handwriting after only a month of handwriting lessons.







# Let's Get Reading

Year 1 and 2 students have been reading up a storm with brand new decodable texts.

With money provided by the P & F we have purchased a substantial amount of take home decodable readers that supports the learning in the classroom.

The variety of both fiction and non fiction texts provide opportunities for students to build their knowledge of the world, vocabulary and fluency along with their phonemic awareness.

Previous take home readers, known as predictable texts have been re-sorted into subject interest areas, such as fairytales, animals and sports. These will be used in the classroom to read for pleasure.







## Let's Get a Hot Cross Bun

Mini whiteboards have become a necessary teaching tool in most classrooms. This strategy provides teachers with an instant visual to gauge student thinking and depth of understanding of skill acquisition. It is also an efficient way for students to receive immediate feedback about their learning and deeper engagement.

This year our teachers will continue to use white boards to practice handwriting, grammar, spelling and maths, however this means that all students need access to their own whiteboard.

**Getting to Know PAM (SIMON everywhere)** 

## Connect

**Connect** is a new feature of PAM (that we are using this year) of PAM that allows you as a parent to provide consent and agreement of policies or statements that apply to your child(ren). The consent and non-consent responses are saved in our SIMON as **Connect Fields**, which are seen by relevant staff members.

For example - during the year, our school will take photographs and videos, which may capture your child(ren)'s participation, directly or indirectly. We utilise a **Connect Field** to request permission from yourselves to publish this media in items like our school newsletter, Yearbook, Annual Report, College website, social/digital media, and newspapers.

When a notification for an Incomplete Connect Field appears in PAM, click on it to go to the relevant Connect Field. Alternatively, click on your child, go to Connect and it will take you to all incomplete Fields awaiting completion, where you need to select the one that is awaiting completion. Fill out all questions, review the documents in the Connect Field and complete the response.


