Dear Families,

It's hard to believe we are at the end of term 1 already! Although a short term, it has certainly been a busy one with students settling into new classrooms quickly and new school routines being adjusted to. Our staff have been busy ensuring their learning programs are engaging and based around the learning data we gathered at the beginning of the year for each student. I am immensely grateful for the expertise, professionalism and compassion our staff takes when educating the students in their care. We are truly blessed at St Margaret's to have exceptional staff in our school community.

Last Wednesday we celebrated Confirmation for many of our Year 6 students. The evening was a wonderful reflection on the gifts of the Holy Spirit, with Bishop Martin Ash speaking to our students about their unique gifts and asking them to embrace these as given to them by the Holy Spirit. We thank the family, friends and staff that attended Mass to support these students. Holidays are a great time to look through your school uniform, ensure all items are named and purchase anything new. As we transition into cooler weather, students may begin wearing their winter uniform. We ask that whatever uniform your child chooses to wear, it is done correctly. Tights or pants should not be worn with the summer dress, for example. A list of the uniform requirements can be found in the parent handbook, or please ask at the office. We encourage hats to be worn year-round. We do try and get outside each day, even in the cooler weather or slight rain. Rain jackets and puffers may be worn outside and taken off when entering the school. It is warm enough inside that a school jumper, or soft-shell jacket is all that is required.

Term 2 fees are now due. We ask that fees are paid a term in advance, or a direct debit be set up. School fees are critical in facilitating the smooth running of schools, including funding vital resources such as infrastructure maintenance and development, classroom resources and the ability to attend excursions and incursions. School fee ensures a conducive learning environment for students. Please ensure you keep up to date with your fees. If you are having trouble making your payments, please make a time to see me.

Enrolments for 2025 are now due. If you are a current family or know of a family that is considering St Margret's this is a reminder to return the forms by the end of the term. Forms are available on our website, or an enrolment pack can be collected from the office.

A reminder that we finish term 1 this Thursday the 28th of March at **1.30pm**. We invite all families to join us in the Church at 12.30pm for our Easter Prayer service, followed by the Easter Raffle draw. Students are able to wear casual clothes with a touch of Easter on Thursday. Please bring a gold coin donation which will go to Caritas.

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


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
