## Leadership and Management News


Dear Families,

As we approach ANZAC Day on April 25<sup>th</sup>, we wanted to take a moment to reflect on the significance of this day and share how our school will be commemorating this important event. ANZAC Day is a day of remembrance in Australia and New Zealand that honours the members of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC) who served and sacrificed during the Gallipoli Campaign of World War I. It has since evolved into a day to recognize all Australians and New Zealanders who have served in wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping missions.

At St Margaret's we believe it's crucial to educate our students about the sacrifices made by our servicemen and women and the importance of remembering their contributions. Here's how we will be commemorating ANZAC Day this year:



- 1. ANZAC Day Assembly: We will be holding a special assembly where students will learn about the history and significance of ANZAC Day through presentations and readings. This will be an opportunity for our school community to come together in remembrance.
- 2. Classroom Activities: Teachers will be incorporating age-appropriate activities into their lessons to help students understand the themes of courage, sacrifice, and remembrance associated with ANZAC Day.
- 3. Minute of Silence: On April 24th, at our ANZAC Assembly, our school will observe a minute of silence to honour the fallen and reflect on the impact of war on our communities.



We encourage families to take part in ANZAC Day commemorations in their own way, whether by attending local dawn services, watching the televised ANZAC Day march, or engaging in discussions about the significance of this day with your children. St Mary's Basilica will be hosting a 9am mass on ANZAC Day. Joel Kearney and three of our student leaders; Ivy, Kiana-Lee and Jackson will be in attendance representing St Margaret's and laying a wreath. All our families are invited to attend this mass.

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We acknowledge the traditional owners of the land that St Margaret's is located on, the Wathaurong people. We pay our respects to Elders past, present and emerging and acknowledge the importance of Aboriginal culture in all the work we do.



All students attending St Margaret's Primary School have the right to feel safe. The care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people is a fundamental responsibility of all within our school. St Margaret's is a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of all children and young people are respected and valued.



## Leadership and Management News

Regular attendance is crucial for student success and academic progress. If your child is unable to attend school due to illness or any other reason, it is essential to notify the school promptly. Not only does this help us ensure the safety of our students, but it also assists us in keeping accurate records.

If your child will be absent from school, please follow these steps to report the absence:

- 1. Contact the Office: Notify our school office by phone or email on the morning of the absence. Please do not contact teachers directly via email or see saw as these are not regularly monitored.
- 2. Please provide the following information when reporting an absence:
  - Your child's full name
  - Class/grade
  - Reason for the absence
  - Expected duration of absence (if known)
- 3. Medical Certificates: If your child is absent due to illness for more than a week, please provide a medical certificate or doctor's note upon their return to school.
- 4. Extended Absences: For planned extended absences (e.g., family vacations), please notify the school in advance by emailing Susan.

If you have not contacted the school, an SMS asking for an explanation will be sent. If no response is received, we follow up with a phone call. If we are still unable to locate the student, the police will be called to conduct a welfare check. Prompt reporting of absences allows us to monitor student attendance effectively and ensures that we can follow up with families in case of any concerns. It also helps us keep our records accurate and up-to-date.

A reminder that **Thursday April 25**<sup>th</sup> is a public holiday for ANZAC Day and **Friday April 26**<sup>th</sup> is a school closure day. Staff will be engaging in professional learning off site.


