Curriculum News

Come on the journey with us...

This week we continue our journey in the Science of Reading and move towards some changes in the literacy block. These changes allow us to include important elements such as, the practice of daily review, explicit teaching of phonics and phonemic awareness, spelling/morphology, fluency, syntax (the arrangement of words and phrases) at the sentence and paragraph level, vocabulary, comprehension and handwriting. This means we are constantly adapting to meet the needs of our students by putting targeted, teaching strategies and routines in place.

Our intention at St Margaret's this year has been to, strategically and deliberately roll out elements of research based instruction that align with the Science of Reading in a new Structured Literacy Block. Skills are explicitly and directly taught to students with clear, step by step explanations, examples and modelling of examples using an 'I do, We do, You do' approach. This teacher-led instruction also enables teachers to provide in time and targeted feedback directly to students.

'Explicit teaching is an approach that recognises learning something new - like reading, spelling, writing, mathematics, tying shoelaces- requires explicit step by step instruction and lots of practice."

In term One we introduced 10 minutes of handwriting instruction across the school. Term Two was all about fluency and the repeated reading of familiar texts. Now in Term Three, we look to build in the practice of daily review into the first 15 minutes of the school day after homeroom.

In the next few weeks we will share with you what a daily review session looks like in each of the classes so that you can discuss this at home with your child.

Your child's school is participating in the 2024 Great Book Swap, a fundraising activity that supports the Indigenous Literacy Foundation and their works with remote Communities across Australia.

The Indigenous Literacy Foundation is a charity that works with 424 remote Communities to supply books and literacy resources, and publish books in First Languages by and for First Nations Peoples.

As part of our *Great Book Swap* program, we will continue to provide all participating schools with access to digital learning resources. As a host of the event, your school will be assigned to a language house and will have access to items such as language fact sheets, videos and maps for cultural learning. 2024 celebrates the third year of *UNESCO's Decade of Indigenous Languages* and we are thrilled to provide your students with the opportunity to learn more about First Languages and the diversity and richness of cultures from books created by remote Community authors and illustrators.

If your child would like to participate in the event, we ask that they bring a favourite book (to be donated) and a gold coin or note to school on the date your school has nominated for this event. Our fundraising site also allows you to make an online donation to your school's *Great Book Swap* in the lead up to the event. Indigenous Literacy Foundation Fact Sheet

Reading Opens Doors - that is, doors to future opportunities and choices.

KEY MESSAGES:

Our purpose is to invest in remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities to provide the tools and resources they request to shape the direction of their children's literacy future.

We are Community-led, responding to requests from remote Communities for culturally relevant books, resources and programs to support Communities to create and publish their stories in languages of their choice.

Everyone can help! Make a donation, host a Great Book Swap, Busk For Change, hold a fundraiser throughout the year, or contact the ILF to discuss your partnership ideas.

We receive no Government funding and rely solely on donations from supporters.

BACKGROUND:

In remote Communities across Australia there is often no infrastructure such as libraries or bookstores. Access to reading material is extremely limited and this impacts the achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children.

Through investment in Community the ILF supports sustainable and positive change in Indigenous literacy through the supply of books and a greater focus on the publication of Indigenous content.

We aim to advocate and build awareness among the wider Australian population of the strengths, knowledges and wisdoms held within remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities. The ILF is a Community-led organisation that has three core programs, including:

- Book Buzz aims to develop pre-literacy skills and familiarity with books for babies and toddlers, through a regular story-time session. Parents and carers are supported and are given the tools to talk about, read and share books with their children, in First Languages and in English.
- 2. Book Supply gifts books that aim to interest and engage the Community in reading and sharing books together. The books are carefully chosen so they are culturally appropriate, and between 50% - 55% are by Indigenous authors or illustrators. The books are distributed by road, air or sea to crèches, playgroups, schools, women's centres, and health centres who use them in different ways.
- 3. Community Publishing supports adults and children to write and illustrate their own stories in languages of their choice. The ILF publish the books and gift them back to the Community. These books are highly desired because they often share a local story that a Community is familiar with and many are written in First Languages.

Since 2011, the ILF has gifted 869,266 books to more than 424 remote Communities, supported 107 playgroups with it's early literacy program and published 126 books reflecting 36 First Languages.

Indigenous Literacy Day

The ILF initiated Indigenous Literacy Day, an annual and national day of advoacy, celebrated on the first Wednesday in September. On this day, the ILF encourages schools and organisations to participate in the celebration of First Nations stories, cultures and languages by watching the annual ILF film and livestream from the Sydney Opera House. 
