We are thrilled to share some exciting news for 2025! Our school has been awarded a \$740,000 Federal Building Grant to address structural issues at the front of our school. This grant will fund essential repairs to drainage and footings, along with general maintenance. Securing such a highly competitive grant is a significant achievement and a testament to our school's commitment to providing the best facilities for our students.

While the construction work won't commence immediately, planning will begin over the school holidays. As part of this project, we will also receive a brand-new double portable building, which will be located along the back fence where the friendship station and trees have recently been removed. Two of our Year 5/6 classes will move into these modern spaces, allowing us to reclaim the entire multipurpose space for broader use. This is a wonderful time for our school as we continue to grow and make the necessary improvements to maintain our beautiful facilities. We are excited about what the future holds and are grateful for the resources to support our thriving school community.
