Dear Families,

Welcome back to Term 3! We hope you had a restful break and are ready for another exciting and productive term of learning and growing together. Last term, we farewelled Miss Patience as she began her maternity leave, and we send her all our best wishes for this incredibly special time. We are thrilled to welcome Jill Connor to our school community. Jill will be teaching in Prep for the remainder of the year and brings with her a deep understanding of our school and students, having already worked across classes as a Casual Relief Teacher. Jill and Patience spent the final week of Term 2 working closely together to ensure a smooth and thorough handover. We're confident your children will enjoy learning with Jill, and we know you will join us in making her feel warmly welcomed.

The cold weather has certainly arrived, and with it a reminder about the importance of wearing the correct school uniform. We ask that students wear either the full academic or full sports uniform—not a combination. Items such as the summer dress paired with tights or sports jumpers over the academic uniform are not in line with our uniform expectations. Wearing the correct uniform builds a sense of pride, belonging, and equality among students. If your child would like to wear a beanie during outdoor times, please ensure it is the official school beanie, which can be purchased via the Flexischools app. There are still plenty available. Non-school beanies will be asked to be removed.

A few reminders as we begin the term: nail polish and fake nails are not permitted at school. They pose a safety risk during learning and play and are not in line with our school uniform policy. We've also had many students return from holidays with hair extensions and decorative braids. While we understand these may be part of cultural celebrations or special travel experiences, we ask that all such hair additions be removed before returning to school to support student safety and maintain focus during learning.

A huge thank you for your generous support of our Story Dogs fundraiser. We raised \$390 for this incredible program, which supports children's literacy by pairing them with trained reading dogs like our much-loved Dash. The students had a wonderful day celebrating Dash and learning more about how Story Dogs help build reading confidence, engagement, and joy. We are so grateful to be part of a community that values and supports initiatives like this.

This term promises to be a busy and exciting one. Our swimming program begins soon, Year 6 students are off to their AFL camp, and we have a number of excursions and extracurricular activities planned across the school. We are proud to be able to offer so many enriching experiences for our students, made possible by the tireless efforts and passion of our staff.

#### What is Wellbeing Literacy?

Wellbeing literacy means having the words and skills to understand, talk about, and care for our own and others' mental health and wellbeing.

In Semester One, Ms Margie, our Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader (MHWL), has been working with the Year 3–6 students to explore ways we can use positive, respectful language that helps everyone feel safe, strong and connected.

Students have been learning the importance of self-regulation strategies for healthy brain development. They're not just learning why caring for mental health and wellbeing matters, they have also been experiencing it for themselves through activities that build resilience, kindness, and confidence.

Smile Patrol School Dental will be visiting our school the week of Monday 20th October, 2025.

Smile Patrol provides free dental health education to all students. If your child is eligible under the Childcare Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS) treatments can be done for free depending on the remaining benefits. If your child is not eligible we will send you an email with an option for a private checkup. But to do this we need your consent.

The first 100 minutes of our celebration will consist of activities involving a national dress parade, singing, dancing, storytelling and crafts from around the world. This will be followed by a shared lunch where we will all get to enjoy the culinary delights of many different cultures.

As a part of our activities session, we are seeking any community members who may be able to share a tradition from their cultural background. This is open to **any activity** with which the person, with the support of a teacher, could teach or share this tradition with a small group of children. Please let us know, preferably by **Friday, 1 August**, if you or someone you know could help us out



in this area so we can start planning for these groups. We have done this in the past resulting in an extremely rewarding experience for those involved.
