Mental Health & Wellbeing Session with Miss Margie – Wednesday 3 September 2025 9:00 – 10:00am

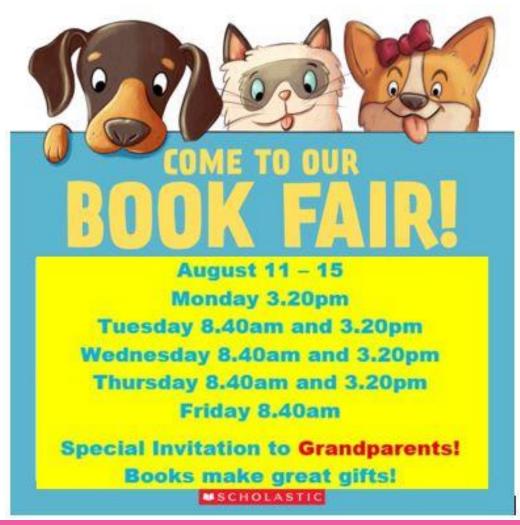

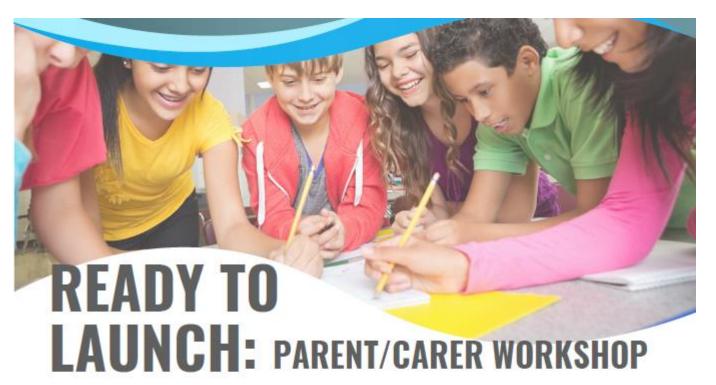

- consent and ethics
- where to go when worry happens
- having a plan

and most importantly having great expectations of ourselves, those who are supporting us and each other.

Digital Tattoo (Year 5/6): 25 Aug

This workshop has been developed to complement the messages students receive in school everyday.

Content will include:

- · ways to stay safe
- · when and where to ask for help
- · respect for self and others online
- · recognising strange behaviour online
- · impact of sharing information
- consent
- · risks of sharing nude pics
- when someone shares content about you without your permission and most importantly creating a digital footprint that your adult self would be proud of.

These interactive workshops have been developed to complement the information provided through 'Respectful Relationships' programs and are delivered through a healthy relationships framework.
