Activities ranged from testing their kicking and handball skills to navigating obstacle courses and participating in small-sided games.



The chance to spend an extended day enjoying the camp and sharing dinner at the facility was a wonderful way for the students to bond further as a cohort outside of the regular school environment. This experience offered valuable lessons in sportsmanship and resilience. Maranda's tailored approach helps students identify the link between their emotions, thoughts, and actions, fostering self-awareness and promoting a calmer, more focused learning state. Last week, she hosted a very successful parent/student evening, sharing foundational strategies and ways for families to support their children's emotional well-being at home. This collaborative approach between the school, Maranda, and parents is key to seeing positive, lasting changes in our students' ability to regulate their emotions.

Today is the deadline for leadership letters to be submitted, and we are now moving into the next exciting stage of our selection process. The speeches for our School and House Captain roles will take place this Monday, and we are eagerly looking forward to hearing our Year 5 students present their ideas and vision. We truly appreciate the significant time and effort all applicants have put into preparing their applications for these important roles. 

Please check all those bookshelves, schoolbags, cupboards, under beds and all the sneaky places books can disappear within the house!




Thanks to everyone who has supported both bookclub and the book fair in 2025. We've been able to add many titles to our collection using the bonus points from these two book-buying opportunities.

Social Media Age Restrictions

#### How to support your child under 16 with the new social media age restrictions

From 10 December 2025, the *Online Safety Amendment (Social Media Minimum Age) Act 2024* will require social media platforms to:

- prevent children and young people under 16 from having a social media account
- deactivate or freeze existing accounts held by people under 16.

Delaying access to social media protects the health and wellbeing of young people and gives them extra time to build real world connections and digital literacy skills.

The responsibility will be on the social media platforms, not parents, carers, children or schools, to implement these new restrictions.

Most popular social media platforms will be age restricted. These include Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, X (formerly Twitter), Reddit and YouTube.

Messaging services and online games, as well as apps and platforms that support health and education, can still be used.

#### How to help under 16s prepare for the change

Parents and carers play an important role in supporting their children to be safe online.

To help get under 16s ready for the social media minimum age requirements, you can go to the <u>eSafety website</u> to learn more about the social media age restrictions and find <u>tips on how to talk</u> about social media age restrictions with young people.

#### What the change means for our school

At our school, all age-restricted social media platforms are blocked for student use on the school network.
